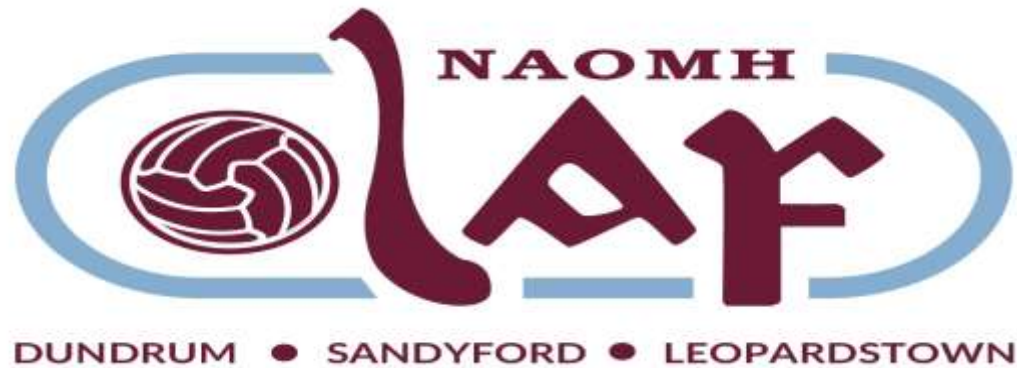

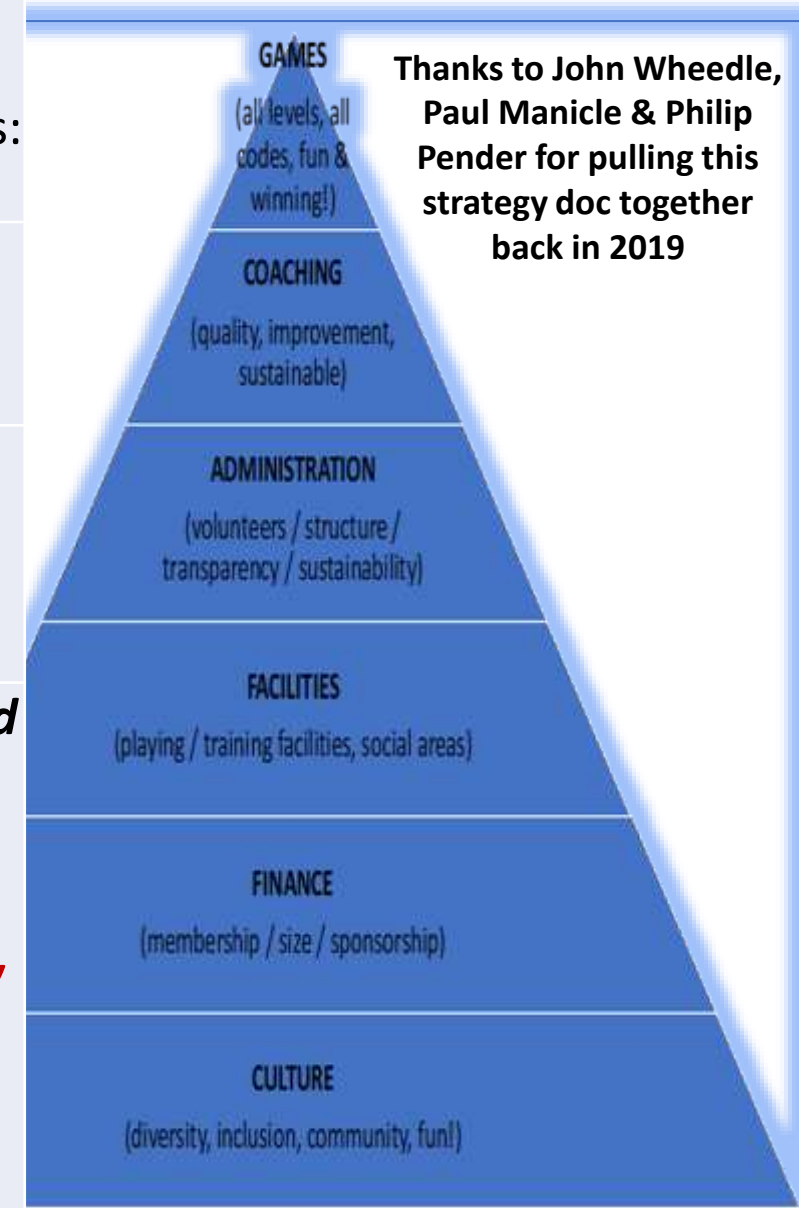

- **A Cháirde – A 2024 highlights Summary Review**
- **The 2024 season has been a breakthrough year across all codes in both Men’s and Women’s competitions.** The investment over the past few years in players development, coaching and infrastructure, combined with a strong emphasis on sports science gym and athlete welfare is paying off. Teams across all levels are displaying a higher level of skill, consistency and tactical awareness, suggesting that the systems and structures implemented in previous seasons are maturing and yielding positive results. The most promotions, finals and semi finals the club has reached in many years across our juvenile and adult sections - **Up to 74 Teams now. A 23% increase on the 60 we had in 2020.**
- **Our 4 Senior codes are progressing to senior championship levels – Ólaf’s is a senior a club – all this is in no small part to Ronan Bourke Adult Games Chair for 4 years.** Without his perseverance and hard work these teams would not have the support to help them achieve the heights they can now reach with their own hard work and will continue to do so. This was achieved by creating an environment where they can be the best they can be here in Naomh Ólafs regardless of levels. Adult teams have increased to 17 Teams. Many thanks to Declan Murphy & Debbie McDaid for supporting Ronan. **Our Senior men retained Div 2 (intercounty level) status despite losing 10 players & more to travel.**
- Our Juvenile section had a particularly good season this year and was awarded the prestigious **“Friends of Dublin Hurling , Juvenile Hurling/Camogie Club of the year 2024 in November.** Our club sustainability charter *AMUIGH FAOIN SPÉIR* launched by the Minister for Sport in 2022 after COVID with composting at it’s centre has helped make our pitches more playable and saved from compactness/flooding. We hope you agree they look well and will come back stronger next spring. **Our new sand based pitch will be a great addition to the club especially once DLRcoco extend the height of the ball stop net near the playground end.**
- It has also led to **DLR allocating 80k grant for Solar on our hall roof** and 20k for dry toilets – this is separate form the many sports grants we have received for the likes of capital projects. DLRcoco also asked the club to speak on its behalf at the Dublin Climate Action week at the Mansion House in September 2024. Thank you to Mary O’Malley for stepping forward as Treasurer with Dermot Brosnan as Vice Treasurer.
- Culminating in October 2024 when we had the **Minister for Sport Catherine Martin, our own GAA president Jarlath Burns, Fr Jim and Fr Lane** & many others join our members to **celebrate our history & those past members and family connections** that have gone before us.
- And of course a fantastic few nights of celebrations after the hard work with our **annual Adult awards night and minor awards night** – long may these continue as we grow and continue to compete and secure more trophies for the club and our community in the coming years.

Back in 2019 before covid, Our Club 5 Year strategy was set out after workshops with members to allow us to improve our club in many ways. The **top three mission statement areas** are below as outlined by our members:

- **1. Attract and retain volunteers to support the operation of the Club**
 - ***We continued to attract new members and volunteers – up to nearly 3k***
- **2. Secure playing facilities for current and future use**
 - ***We expanded our reach and our lease with Benildus and a new sand pitch with a new extended skills astro area***
- **3. Culture and community enriching the lives of our members, families and the communities we serve .**
 - ***We have increased the club's profile, engagement and the positive standing in our community and wider afield by working closely with many local schools, Balally Church, local DLR councillors and Govt politicians and local businesses through the likes of SBID and Sponsors***
 - ***The Farmers Market, Juiceboxx, Cupla Scup and created a plinth for social gatherings – upgraded the hall and many other sports clubs are using the facilities and function room.***

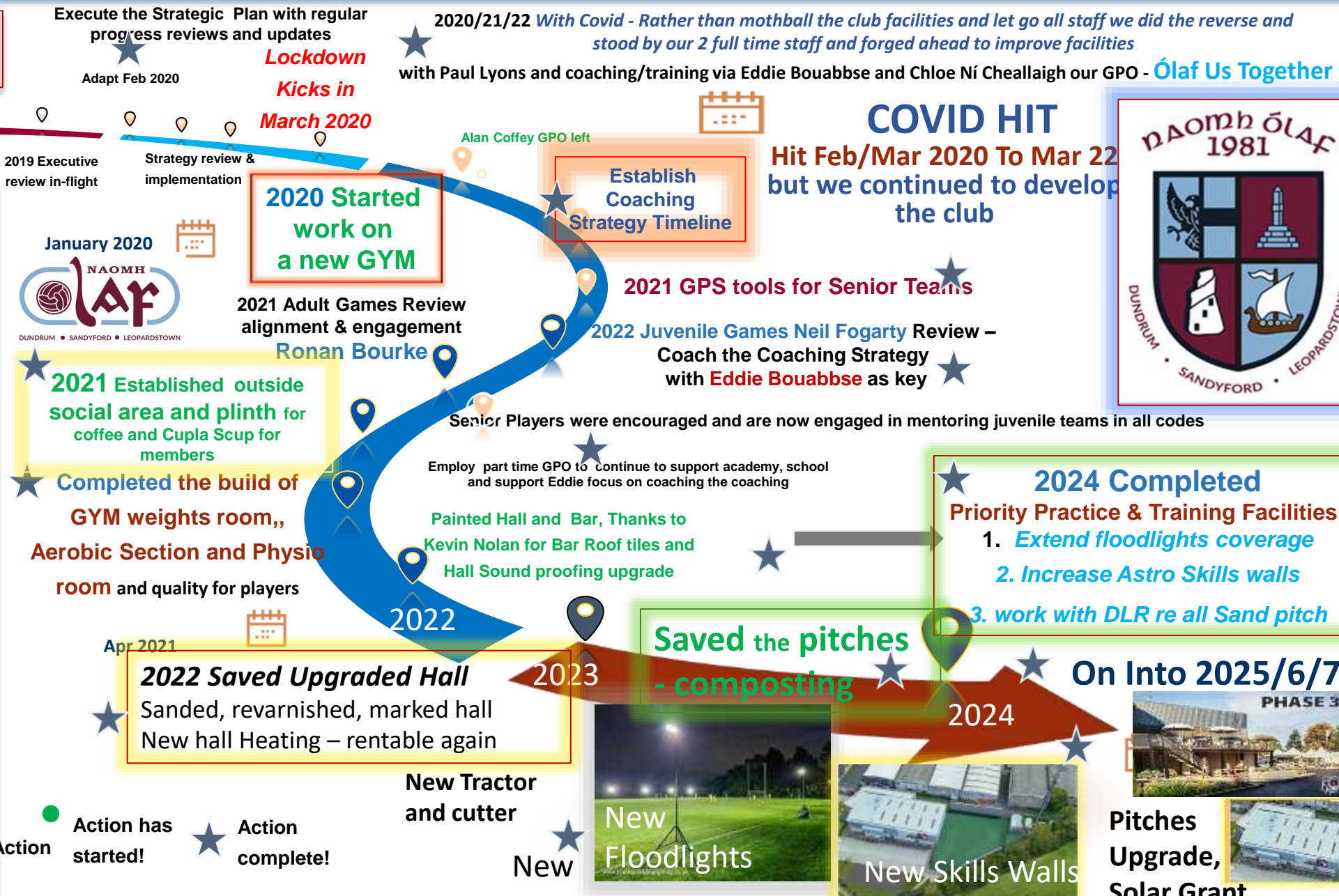

As we approach the end of 2024 the club finishes it's 43rd year (approaching nearly 3,000 members) since it was created in 1981 with the help of Club President Mick Brown and 11 others and who became our first chairperson.

Back then it was a vision that joined up with Br Brendan O'Sullivan of the De La Salle Order, who purchased the lands in 1966 to build St. Benildus College with the surrounding playing fields and one of the first college principals He was from Kerry and only passed away in September 2019.

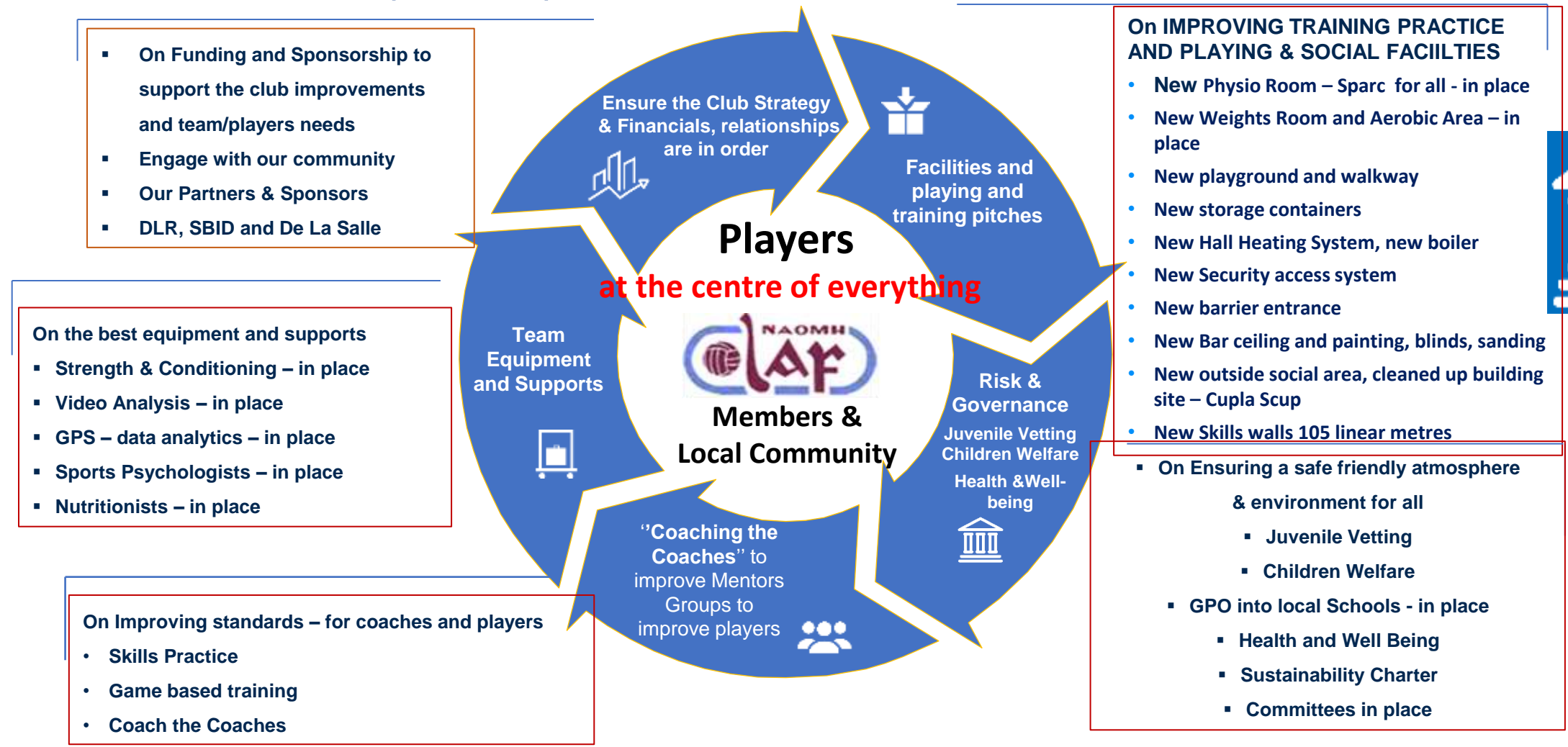
As a club we strive to continue that vision our own founders had when they sat down at a kitchen table and thought about what the future might look like and how they could improve their own community.

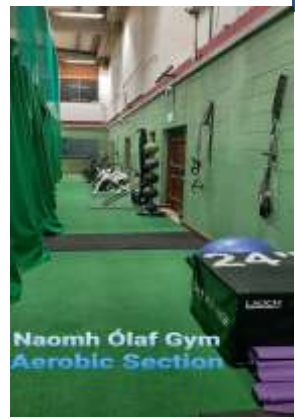

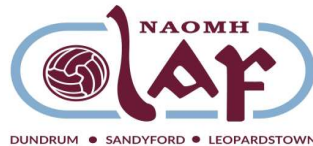

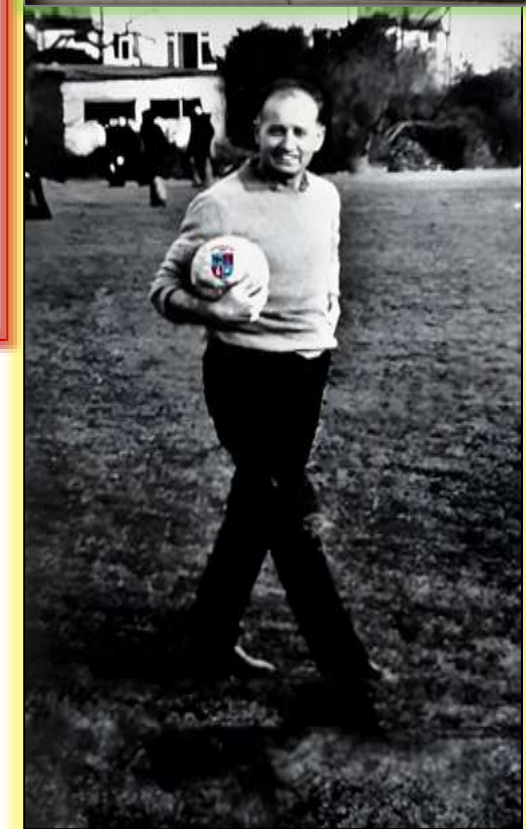

- **Sports Grants** – we repurposed our sports grants for the like of **upgrading the existing floodlights to LED heads.** Thanks to Terence O'Halloran.
- Please support the **fundraising campaign that will go towards the cost of this extension and future pitch improvements.**
- We wish to thank **Paul Lyons,** our clubhouse manager who in addition to his role as our head barman,, engages and maintains relation all the various sponsors, Tribe and the sports clubs that the use our club.

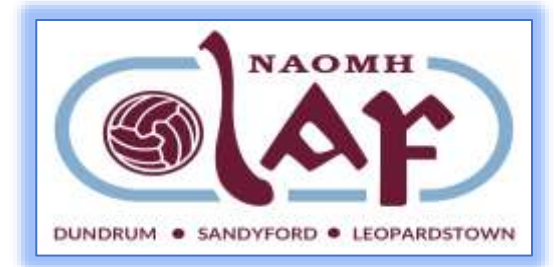
